Editorial Comment

BE DEER AWARE - ROAD SAFETY

As autumn approaches, the Highways Agency and partners in The Deer Initiative are reminding drivers to watch out for deer, particularly at dawn and dusk.

Every year, people are killed or injured in road collisions with wild deer around England. The Highways Agency has recorded over 2,000 deer-vehicle collisions since January 2009 on the motorway and A-road network in England alone.

The periods of highest risk are autumn and spring, particularly around dawn and dusk. The Deer Initiative estimates that there could be up to 74,000 deer-vehicle collisions every year in the UK, around 80 per cent of which are in England.

A key to reducing the number and severity of these incidents is to get drivers to be 'DeerAware' to slow down and watch out when they see deer warning signs at the roadside.

Advice to drivers:-

- When you see deer warning signs, check your speed and stay alert.
- If your headlights are on, use full beams when you can. But dip your headlights if you see deer as they may 'freeze'.
- More deer may follow the first one you see.
- Be prepared to stop. Try not to suddenly swerve to avoid a deer. A collision with oncoming traffic or another obstacle could be even worse.
- If you have to stop, use your hazard warning lights.
- Do not approach an injured deer, it could be dangerous.
- If you collide with a deer (or witness a collision) and someone may be injured, or if vehicles or deer in the road are a risk to road safety, then you should treat this as an emergency and ring 999 for the police or ambulance service immediately.
- You can use an Emergency Roadside Telephone if one is available.
- To report any injured deer please ring the RSPCA 24-hour cruelty line on 0300 1234 999.

Dr Jochen Langbein, project leader for the UK Deer Vehicle Collisions Project at The Deer Initiative, said: As days get shorter in the autumn, busy traffic times coincide with dawn and the early part of the night when deer are most active and hardest to spot. In wooded areas in particular, there may be very little warning before one or several deer bolt across.

Dog thefts

Dog thefts are a common occurrence. There have been 3 reported thefts in north Hampshire very recently. See the Hampshire section. In each case the dogs were cockers spaniels.

It appears the dogs were targeted as the thieves had to make the effort of releasing them so it appears to be predetermined crimes. Even if you think your dogs are safe and secured in kennels there is a possibility that thieves will resort to force to break into an enclosure/kennel to steal.

As with your equestrian property take special care of your dogs. If they are a pedigree breed, working type dog seriously consider getting them micro chipped. This will assist if a dog similar to the one stolen is found. Make sure you have good quality photographs of your animals (preferably without other animals or people included)

It isn't rocket science to think who the usual suspects will be so take special care and interest in who is in your area. Take details of anyone or vehicles that you deem suspicious and tell your police straight away.

Thieves may not appreciate the condition of a dog when they steal it and as a consequence when they realise it is not what they thought may abandon it. With this in mind if you find a dog loose consider the fact it may have been

stolen and abandoned in addition to the possibility it may just have got lost! Certainly contact the police to report the find but most Police Forces do not take in stray dogs but may search their local databases for reports of stolen dogs. Advice is to contact your local dog warden who should assist (bear in mind dog wardens may not work weekends and only 9-5 Monday to Friday!!) RSPCA, Vets as well as dog wardens have access to microchip readers so should be able to scan a dog to establish whether it has been chipped.

There are several web sites dedicated to lost and stolen dogs. Best advice is "Google " to find a definitive list.

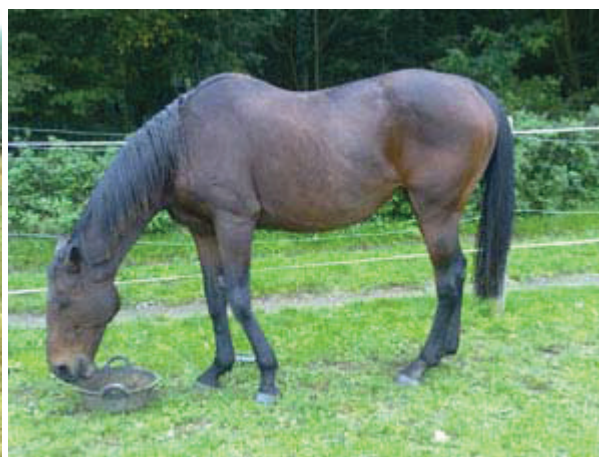
Stolen - 16.1hh Bay gelding - Bolsover CR 53079/10 - 23rd-24th Sept

Those on the scheme must have an open condition on their Firearms Certificate and hold a relevant insurance policy.

If accepted on the scheme, members are provided with an authorisation from the Chief Constable to act as a Humane Animal Dispatcher.

Due to a poor harvest of hay this year we have had two large thefts of hay from the Mid Kent area, store hay away from the road and somewhere that is inaccessible to potential offenders. Feed is being targeted as well, don't leave it in bags that can be stolen and resold.

Tack Room Thefts

Sadly there has been a number of tack room thefts this week. This is a timely reminder for all horse owners to review the security of their properties to minimise the risk of being targeted. Many insurance companies stipulate specific standards and requirements for locks and security products, so be sure to check you are compliant.

Make sure your yard does not attract unwanted visitors or thieves. Try not to advertise your location with road signs or livery adverts. If you have a drive up to the stables install a gate at the road end to deter casual callers. If practical, consider locking gates when the yard is unattended. If you have staff, encourage them to challenge strangers in a friendly manner. For instance, asking "can I help you?" will discourage any potential offender because they know they have been seen and can be described to the police.

Stables, tack rooms and outbuildings that make up the average stable yard are one of the most common targets for the rural criminal. This is because they are often sited in fairly remote locations and are frequently left unattended for long periods, sometimes overnight. Tack rooms in particular can be very rewarding if you are a thief. Do not label the tack room door; it makes it too easy for thieves to find. Horsewatch can provide yard security signs to advise that property is marked as a deterrent to theft. **Make sure your property is marked in some way** – not only will it ensure you can identify your belongings if recovered following a theft, but it will also make it undesirable to steal in the first place as it will be difficult for the thief to move on.

Efforts should be made not to leave tools and other equipment on full view around the yard. Not only are they likely to be attractive to the rural thief, many of them could be used to break in to the stable or tack room. A shovel, for instance, makes an excellent lever and is often used to force open a door or window and casually stored wheelbarrows makes a perfect conveyance to move property to an awaiting vehicle.

Preventing unauthorised people easily entering and leaving a yard will go a long way towards preventing theft and/or damage.
